

# EPSCOR UPDATE Promoting Innovative Research





OK NSF Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research | April 2021 | No. 2



Presidents of 16 Oklahoma institutions of higher education nominated the top 21 undergraduate student researchers in the state to participate in the

2021 Research Day at the Capitol. The prestigious 26<sup>th</sup> annual event has hosted a breadth of diverse and relevant research, including using dandelion extract to treat cervical cancer and the development of a new mesoscopic carbon material that could prove useful in battery electrodes and hydrogen storage. "All of the student nominees are to be commended for being selected to represent their institutions at Research Day at the Capitol," said Kevin Wagner, project director and principal investigator, OK NSF EPSCOR. "They represented their colleges and universities exceedingly well!"

As a component of the event, students presented their work to an independent panel of judges on March 30<sup>th</sup> live via Zoom. The judges have identified the top three students in each of two categories— (1) *Regional, Community, and Tribal Colleges* (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> place) and (2) *Research-Intensive Institutions* (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> place). One overall *Grand Prize Winner* was also selected—that winner could be chosen from either category.



These students will receive the following awards:

- Grand Prize is a \$500 award plus \$4,000 summer research internship; \$2,500 award goes to the to the sponsoring Oklahoma college/university lab to offset expenses of hosting the internship.
- First (\$500), second (\$250), and third (\$250) place will be awarded in each of the following two categories: 1) Research Intensive Institutions and 2) Regional, Community and Tribal Colleges.
